Unfortunately, but little commercial use is made of herring as a food fish in central, western, and arctic Alaska. In 1907 a herring saltery was established on Simeonof Island, one of the Shumagin group, in central Alaska. Owing to the low prices realized for the prepared product, and the high cost of transportation, the plant was closed down in 1908 and 1909, but it was reopened this year. A small quantity is marketed fresh, but the great bulk of the catch is made by the Indians, who consume the fish, either fresh or after being dried. a Report upon Natural History Collections made in Alaska between the years 1877 and 1881, by Edward W.
